**afcamp.org**: community parent resource center that advocates for children with disabilities and at-risk youth.

**birth23.org**: programs that support CT families until their child's third birthday if they have concerns about their development.

**connectingtocarect.org**: learning collaborative to promote and educate members and providers in the Wrap approach to treatment planning.

**cpacinc.org/default.aspx**: CPAC is a statewide organization that provides support and information to families that have children with a disability or chronic illness between the age of birth to 26 become the best advocates for their children.

**chnct.org**: Community Health Network (CHN) is a non-profit managed care organization dedicated to improving medical services and health outcomes for CT's Medicaid members.
