

## NMNC 2.603.02 Medication Management (MM) (Adult)

Medication management is the level of outpatient treatment where the primary service rendered by a qualified prescriber is the evaluation of the member's need for psychotropic medications, the provision of a prescription, and ongoing medical monitoring. The prescribing provider coordinates treatment with other treatment providers and primary care/specialty providers, as appropriate. Licensure and credentialing requirements specific to facilities and individual practitioners are found in Beacon's provider manual/credentialing information.

The non-participation is of such degree that treatment at this level of care is rendered ineffective or unsafe, despite multiple documented attempts to address non-participation issues; or</li> <li>Consent for treatment is withdrawn by the individual and/or guardian or conservator</li> </ol>

## **Exclusion Criteria**

The following criterion is sufficient for exclusion from this level of care:

1. There is another prescribing provider already certified and providing medication management services
